- implement simple repairs and basic maintenance of textile products;
- identify textiles for various purposes;
- recognise the basic professional terminology;
- economically use materials and energy.

#### Optional:

- recognise spots and stains, implement basic procedures for cleaning and washing textiles and ironing by hand and machine.
- choose appropriate materials, equipment and tools and implement various techniques to make accessories or textile products.

In addition, the holder of the certificate also upgraded his/her key professional skills and competences with key general knowledge and skills in line with national standards.

#### 4. RANGE OF OCCUPATIONS ACCESSIBLE TO HOLDER OF THE CERTIFICATE

The holder of the certificate can find employment at:

- in the clothing industry,
- in craft workshops:
- in clothing repair shops;
- in laundries and dry cleaners;
- in other positions that require a basic knowledge for simple routine work.


